

Dear Parents, Carers and Families

Here we are, the final newsletter for the term—it has been such a busy term and I have lots of information to share with you. Firstly, I would like to thank parents and families for their patience and support around some classroom changes that occurred at the start of the term, as well as those who have had their IEP meetings delayed due to teacher absences in the last few weeks. I understand that this can be disruptive however, we have taken every step to ensure smooth transitions for students and to ensure that each student has an appropriate educational plan in place. As is our practice IEPs and Touch Plans etc will be sent home in the final week of term, *unless we contact you directly.*

Secondly, I would like to thank our relief staff for always being there to ensure our students are supported throughout the day. Relief EAs and Teachers are a bit like unicorns, so when you find them you value them, only then do they sprinkle their magic dust.

Mrs Leah Coutinho was supposed to be on leave this term, but she put that on hold because we did not have a replacement. We are very appreciative of this sacrifice, but can now advise that Mr Michael McGoldrick will be returning to our school next term to teach in LA 3,4, allowing Ms Leah her well deserved leave. Mr McGoldrick has taught in Education Support for many years and has previously been a member of our staff. We are happy to welcome him back. We may have a few additional changes next term, as some staff adjust their work hours—this will be managed with the least disruption to classes. We have almost completed a Merit Selection process for EAs and will know the results of that next week.

As many of you are aware from previous Newsletters we have been discussing the closure of the school for a day each semester to hold Parent Report Meetings. This has been circulated to parents and staff via our survey and discussed at length with staff and the School Council. The survey results supported the views of the Council so I have informed the Regional Director of Schools of our decision, which has now been approved. The Semester One Parent Report Meeting Day will be **Wednesday June 24th 2026** and Semester 2 will be Wednesday **December 9th 2026**. Both days will operate from 9—3 and 4-6pm allowing some after hours time for those who are working during the day. We believe this will be a practice that provides the parent/carer community with an excellent opportunity to engage with staff and discuss their child's progress and celebrate successes in an efficient manner. Learning Area LA 2

The students in LA2 have made a wonderful start to the term and have settled into classroom routines with confidence. They are becoming familiar with daily expectations, transitioning more smoothly between activities, and showing increasing independence within the classroom.

Our Pre-primary and Kindy 2 students have been enjoying Sensorium Theatre sessions on Thursday mornings. Through engaging themes such as *Here is the Sea*, *Twinkle Twinkle* and *Peas and Porridge*, students have been exploring the sounds, sights and textures of each theme in a rich, sensory learning environment. These sessions support engagement, curiosity and communication in meaningful ways.

With Miss Liz, our Visual Arts teacher, students have been creating beautiful artwork, including lanterns to celebrate Lunar New Year and Matisse inspired collages. These creative experiences encourage self-expression and provide opportunities for students to explore colour, texture and cultural traditions.

The gym and the library have quickly become favourite places to visit within the school. Students enjoy participating in movement activities in the gym and exploring books and stories during library sessions, supporting both their physical development and early literacy skills.

It has also been lovely to see students beginning to form friendships, engage positively with their peers, and build social connections within the class.

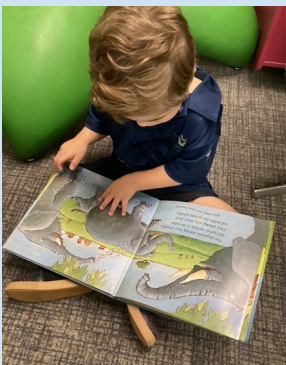

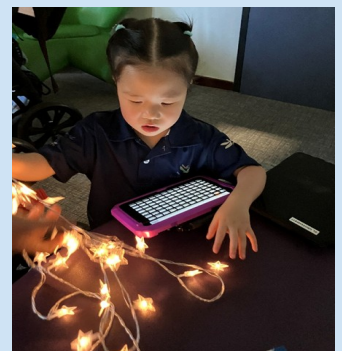

LA 7/8 have had a fun and busy term together! We enjoyed celebrating Lunar New Year across the curriculum, including making delicious dumplings with Ms Lisa. In Literacy we are reading sensory stories. This is a great way to develop our conversational skills using our communication devices. We have incorporated ICT skills and choice making during our Shared Writing sessions.

Our Yoga session in the gym have also been a favourite because we can come out of our chairs and stretch out together. We have begun playing All Abilities football outside our classroom and are looking forward to making our team shirts next term.

- ◆ *Please be on time as late starts shortens your meeting time.*



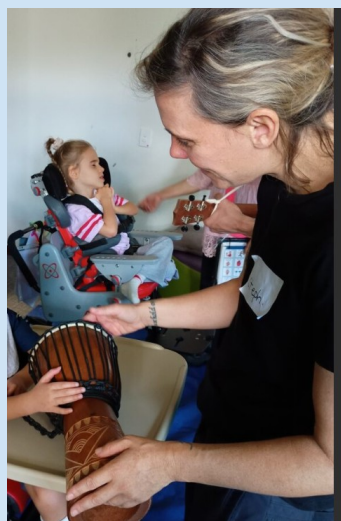
Sensorium Theatre
