

Dear Parents, Carers and Families

Welcome to the final newsletter of the term. The big topic of discussion this week has been the school closure for Report Meetings—a new initiative by the Department of Education. We know that many families often choose not to meet each semester, whilst others like to meet in both semesters. Some like to come onsite and see student work, others are happier to talk on the phone—we would like to be able to offer a little of both.

From the school's perspective having a day just for reporting, allowed teachers to focus on the task at hand and not have to squeeze meetings into a day of teaching, yard duty and other responsibilities. It allowed them to solely focus on students and families. For Education Assistants it gave them an opportunity to provide classroom support which they don't ordinarily have time to do and also to undertake additional professional development to assist them in carrying out their important work—supporting students.

Feedback from parents throughout the day was positive, they felt less rushed and more focussed, they also felt they had the attention of the teacher. A short feedback questionnaire is included in this newsletter for you to share your feedback with us—this will help inform our planning for the next Reporting Day on December 9th.

Whether you met by phone or chose not to meet this time round—I am sure you were just as pleased as I was when you read your child's report. They were terrific this semester, so many students meeting so many goals—I think the largest number of 'achieved' goals in a semester in awhile. We have a wonderful cohort of students who are doing their very best to become independent learners. Congratulations to all!

In semester two we will be working hard to develop student independence, skills even further. One way of doing this is to increase their opportunities to be independent and this starts with entering & leaving school. Folks, particularly those of K/PP/1, it's time to leave the kiddos at the door, (or gate)... time to do the drop and dash. After a semester of entering the class with your child and possibly staying awhile to chat we are now asking you to wait outside the door or the gate. If you collect early, go to the Admin office—they will notify the class of your arrival. If you need to chat with the teacher, please request a meeting by messaging on SeeSaw for an appropriate meeting time. Brief immediate messages can be shared with staff at the gate.

If you would like to meet and chat with other parents we remind you that our Cuppa & Chat sessions take place every Monday morning at drop off time and Thursdays after assemblies in the House. We would love to see you there.



So, thank you for being an active part of school life at Castlereagh, I look forward to Semester Two and working with everyone to provide the very best for all students. I hope that this next semester continues to be full of enthusiasm for learning, collaboration in planning and progression of partnerships.

Following multi-step instructions

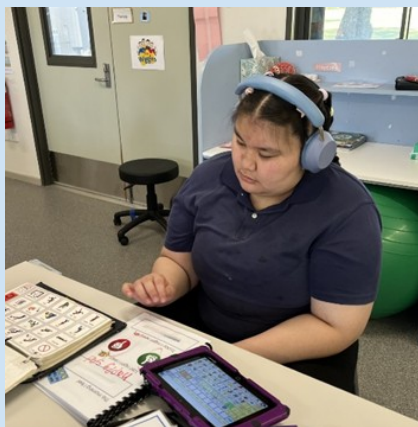
Cleaning as they go

Dog biscuits – mixing, shaping, and packaging treats

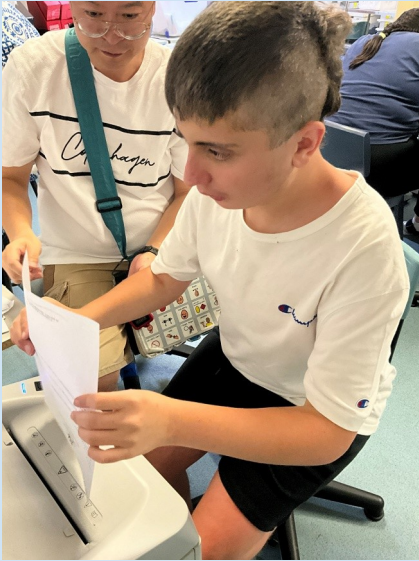

Please be aware that respiratory tract infections or colds can be everywhere, especially in winter! Here are some points which may help children from catching them:

- Please keep your child **home from school to rest** if they have a **cold/cough/fever**.
- Hand Hygiene - even when our hands look clean, they can still be carrying lots of germs! Good hand hygiene is the best way to stop germs and infections spreading from person to person. **Conduct hand hygiene after coughs and sneezes**, before eating, after **going to the toilet** and if hands are visibly dirty.
- Use **tissues once** and then throw them in the bin.
- Keep children away from smoke – it irritates their eyes and nasal passages, making it more likely that they will catch a cold.

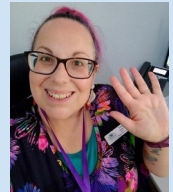

Paralpi extends Zaachariaha's acclaimed Inma series and reflects a deeply cultural and immersive narrative grounded in Country. The artwork depicts the sounds of Paralpi, a significant place just outside Mimili on the eastern APY Lands in South Australia. As Zaachariaha describes, Paralpi is a place where people come to embrace and celebrate children, where they are taught by Elders to move and mimic their Clan emblem – for Mimili, this being the maku (witchetty grub).

Federal Government Update

AusAlert

The Australian Government is launching AusAlert, a new national warning system that sends emergency messages to compatible mobile devices. AusAlert is a fast and reliable way to help keep Australians informed so they can act quickly during local and national disasters. These could be natural hazards like bushfires, floods and cyclones, as well as security threats or public health emergencies.

Understand AusAlert

AusAlert will send messages regarding emergency events to all Australians on their mobile devices, including:

- phones
- tablets
- smart watches
- safety watches
- vehicle devices.

AusAlert will behave differently to standard text messaging. It includes 2 alert levels, both featuring a unique siren ringtone and a message that appears on device screens.



Critical alert

The critical alert is an intrusive alert that overrides silent and do not disturb settings. It is used only when there is an imminent threat to life and property. Users cannot opt out.

Priority alert

The priority alert does not override silent and do not disturb settings. It is sent when advice is required on potential events. Users can opt out of this alert by accessing notifications in their device settings.

WA STUDENT ASSISTANT PAYMENT

The WA Student Assistance Payment helps parents and carers with cost-of-living pressures associated with sending their children to school.

All Western Australian school students in Kindergarten to Year 12, with a valid WA student number, are eligible for this cost-of-living payment.

You can claim \$250 for each secondary student and \$150 for students attending primary school or Kindergarten.

The payment will be available through the ServiceWA app, with parents and carers encouraged to set up or update their ServiceWA account and have an active Digital ID.

Claims open on Monday 20 July 2026, and claims must be received by Friday 25 September 2026.

Eligible students must be enrolled in Kindergarten to Year 12 at a Western Australian public school, non-government school or registered for home schooling and have a valid WA student number (WASN).

SAVER PLUS

Saver Plus is available year-round to eligible parents and carers, with many families seeking support when larger school costs arise.
